## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To Our Alumni and Friends,

QLF finishes 2012 in enviable fashion — management, program, and finance. Our Governing Boards could not be in better hands. We have had a 25% growth in new members including younger Alumni who will one day take over the duties from the stalwarts who have guided this organization wisely and well for so long.

In programs, there were a number of benchmarks to include a successful second season for *The Acadian Internship in Regional Conservation and Stewardship* (where participants study large landscape conservation across Downeast Maine and New Brunswick).

Brent Mitchell, Vice President for International Stewardship, represented QLF at the quadrennial World Conservation Congress in Korea in September, the “world’s largest conservation event.” As President of the George Wright Society, he is currently working with top National Park Service and Parks Canada scientists planning a conference on protected areas in March 2013.

We hosted our first eco-tour (to Belize) to connect QLF constituents with places where we have active region-to-region exchanges. During the Belize trip, dozens of Belizean NGO partners (and now QLF Alumni) attended a dinner for tour participants to explain how our conservation exchanges have helped them. Another tour last summer took a QLF group to Newfoundland’s French Shore to see the many and varied culture and heritage projects QLF is conducting under the management of Dr. Candace Cochrane. Last February, QLF’s Executive Vice President, Beth Alling, organized a Middle East Alumni Regional Meeting in Oman at the invitation of the Omani Government. There, QLF’s Middle East Alumni and North American participants forged a new compact to collaborate in the future.

In September, QLF received the largest single bequest in our history. Gifts like this are an expression of the personal relationships that QLF is known for. As President of QLF, it is my honor to carry on the wishes of these wonderful donors through new and exciting programs to meet our 21st century Mission. Examples will include: a build-out of the Leadership (Intern and Volunteer) Program; a follow-up to the QLF Congress (2006) to implement the Global Leadership Network; more QLF tours to introduce Alumni and Board Directors to what we do as well as where and with whom we do it; new international exchanges and stewardship opportunities, including the Middle East; and new collaborations in our home region with organizations as diverse as the International Grenfell Association, the U.S. National Park Service, and Environment Canada.

To conclude, as we enter the new year, QLF is well positioned — a veteran staff, exciting new programs, and an engaged cohort of Directors in the U.S. and Canada. Thank you all for your trust, your confidence in us, and for your financial support.

Battle Harbour, Labrador. British physician and spiritual leader Wilfred Grenfell opened the first medical facility for fishermen and Inuit here in 1893. Over the next 40 years, he established hospitals and nursing stations in coastal Newfoundland and Labrador. He also helped organize the first fishing cooperative. Today, the Battle Harbour Historic Trust has restored many of the buildings in the original settlement. Battle Harbour has become a major tourism destination.

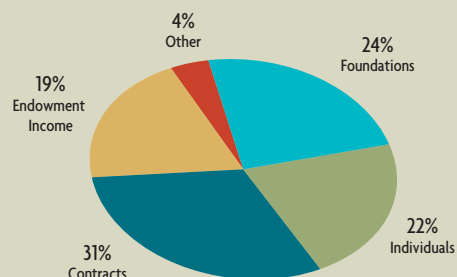

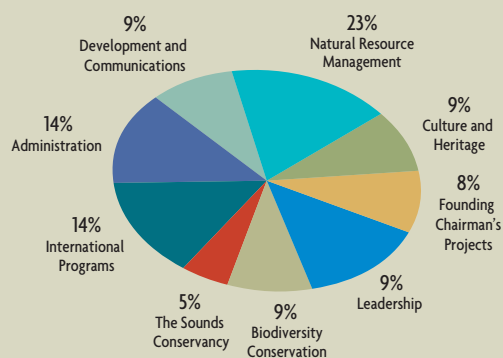

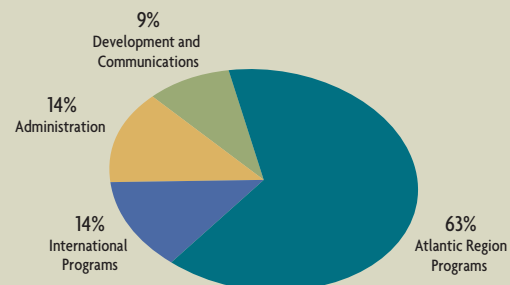
Combined Income (U.S. and Canada)
