AS PART OF THE STAYING CONNECTED INITIATIVE, IN 2024, QLF WAS A LEAD PARTNER IN THE FIRST NORTHEASTERN NORTH AMERICAN LANDSCAPE CONNECTIVITY SUMMIT HELD IN MONTREAL, QUEBEC. THE SUMMIT CONVENED 200 MEMBERS OF GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, CONSERVATION ORGANIZATIONS, AND ACADEMIA

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QUEBEC-LABRADOR FOUNDATION, INC.

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REPRESENTING THE FIVE EASTERN PROVINCES OF CANADA, SEVEN NORTHEASTERN U.S. STATES, AND INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE ECO-REGION. THE SUMMIT SERVED TO ELEVATE THE VISIBILITY AND IMPORTANCE OF THE REGION'S CONNECTED FOREST LANDSCAPES AND HAS RESULTED IN A COMPREHENSIVE DOCUMENT, THE PATHWAYS GUIDE, A HIGH-LEVEL BLUEPRINT OF PRIORITY ACTIONS TO ADVANCE ITS CONNECTIVITY CONSERVATION AND RESTORATION IN THE ECO-REGION. THE STAYING CONNECTED INITIATIVE'S SUMMIT WAS MANAGED BY A SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT BASED AT A QLF FIELD OFFICE IN VERMONT.
